

STEP BY STEP, WE HONOR THE FALLEN

This year, we are preparing for the 4th annual 9/11 Memorial Tower Climb. Participants are local first responders who climb or walk the equivalent of 110 stories—the same number of floors of the World Trade Center. Each climber wears a badge displaying the name and photo of one of the 416 fallen first responders that ran into the buildings to help on that fateful day. As participants reach the end of the memorial climb, they ring a ceremonial fire bell on the street and place their name on the board symbolizing they completed the climb for the fallen first responder.

While the climbers must be first responders, we invite anyone to come watch, remember, support, and cheer on today's heroes as they climb. On street level there will be meaningful memorial displays, including a piece of twisted steel from the towers, the photo quilt sharing the faces of thousands who died in the attacks, a moving opening ceremony with local leaders, and a guest speaker from NYFD to share their personal story.
