





For many years, City Center has been a proud participant in the downtown Fort Worth TIF district—a public—private partnership designed to encourage investment, development, and cultural growth in the urban core. Through this agreement, a portion of property tax revenue generated within the district was reinvested to fund improvements such as infrastructure, streetscape enhancements, and the free evening and weekend parking program that many tenants and visitors enjoyed.

On December 31, 2025, the City of Fort Worth's Tax Increment Financing (TIF) agreement that supported this program expires. This means that beginning on January 1, 2026, the downtown garages that were once part of the TIF program will no longer have free parking after 6 p.m. on weekdays and on weekends.

City Center, however, remains committed to supporting the downtown community. Currently, we are in conversations with the city to propose a new parking program that would offer discounted parking rates for the non-profit performing arts organizations in downtown Fort Worth, helping maintain accessible and affordable parking for patrons attending performances held at Bass Hall, Jubilee Theater and Circle Theater going forward.





We're excited to share that our parking garages have recently undergone an upgrade to the entry and exit terminals. The new system enhances both convenience and efficiency for our tenants and visitors.

With this update, we are now able to accept additional forms of payment, including Apple Pay, Google Pay, and other contactless payment options, when exiting the garage. These improvements are part of our ongoing commitment to providing a seamless parking experience throughout City Center.

We appreciate your patience during the transition and hope you enjoy the added convenience of the new system!
